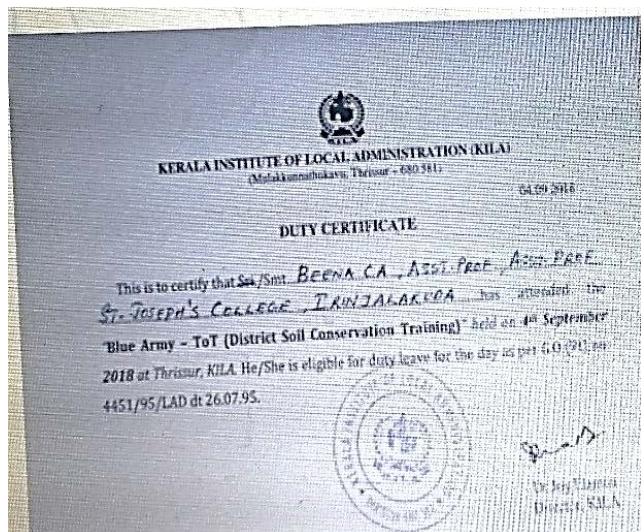
BLUE ARMY




